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Our objective:

To make NVC widely available in the Republic of Moldavia

The work so far:

Marshall Rosenberg introduced NVC to Moldavia in July, when he offered three workshops at a conference called "Surviving Trauma with Dignity," held in Baku. Inspired by the workshops, one conference participant, Liliana Raileanu, decided to help bring NVC to others in her country. Together with Valentina Olarescu, Liliana subsequently organized the first two-day NVC workshop in Moldavia: a training class, led by Eva Rambala, for psychologists, social workers, and NGO members.

Between now and 2005 we want to:

- Use broadcast and print media to heighten public awareness of NVC
- Offer NVC workshops that are open to the public
- Establish NVC in the Moldavian business community
- Collaborate with Romanian colleges on the translation of NVC books and articles, and the organization of jointly sponsored activities
- Make NVC available to members of NGOs that support vulnerable groups, such as orphans, disabled children, enslaved women, and families in crisis
- Train psychologists to use NVC in their work
