

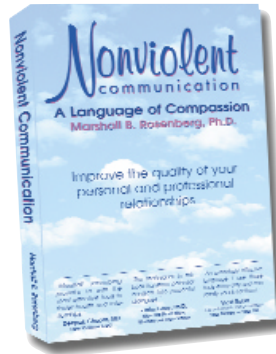
How Can We Create Lasting Peace and Safety in Today's World?

Deheisha, Palestinian Refugee Camp

When Dr. Rosenberg entered Palestinian refugee camp a dozen men began yelling, "Murderer!" "Assassin!" "Child-killer!" After a compassionate dialog, the tension eased and the men were able to hear the purpose of Dr. Rosenberg's visit to the camp.

This exchange created an opportunity for training that in more than 160 pupils and teachers celebrating the culmination of a two-year NVC UNICEF program in 4 Israeli and 4 Palestinian schools.

One hundred tribesmen killed!

NVC Training in Northern Nigeria

While I was mediating between warring Christian and Moslem tribes, one of the Chiefs stood and very emphatically said, "If we know how to communicate in the way that you're talking about, we don't have to kill each other."

People from both sides eagerly agreed to be trained, and the violence between the tribes ceased.

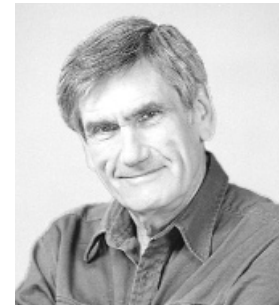

NVC Training for Serbians & Croats

At the beginning of peace initiative training in NVC skills, citizens from Serbia and Croatia were enraged with one another.

In 7 days they left singing one another's songs. They went on to create an educational project that has brought these same skills to over 30,000 children and 6,000 educators in the former Yugoslavia.

In 1984 he founded The Center for Nonviolent Communication (CNVC), which over the past 27 years has grown into an international organization providing training and initiating peace programs in over 30 countries.

Currently based in Switzerland, Dr. Rosenberg often travels in Europe, the US, Africa, the Middle East, and Latin America offering training and mediation.
